Apr 13th-15th - A slow moving and cold storm system brought periods of rain and snow to much of Utah, with the heaviest precipitation occurring across the northern mountains. Gusty winds blew ahead and just behind the surface cold front and in the vicinity of thunderstorms that developed along the front. Precipitation fell as rain in the lower elevations for the majority of the event, but the rain turned to snow along the benches and some valleys along the Wasatch Front toward the end of the storm.

BEAVER — Stormy weather caused a rapid series of wrecks Thursday afternoon about 10 miles south of Beaver, including four involving semitrailers, police said.

The incident began around 1:30 p.m., when a semitrailer traveling south jackknifed across the southbound lanes, which were covered in hail and slush from a powerful storm, according to the Utah Highway Patrol.

A second semitrailer braked and was hit by a third truck, causing the third vehicle to cross into the northbound side of the freeway, the agency said. A fourth semitrailer also jackknifed.

A sedan was also impacted by the quick succession of wrecks, the Utah Highway Patrol said. Four additional crashes occurred nearby about the same time.

Freeway traffic was shut down in both directions for about two hours, police said. One semitrailer driver was hurt and two people in the affected sedan were also injured and taken to the hospital. None of the injuries were considered life-threatening, the Utah Highway Patrol said.
