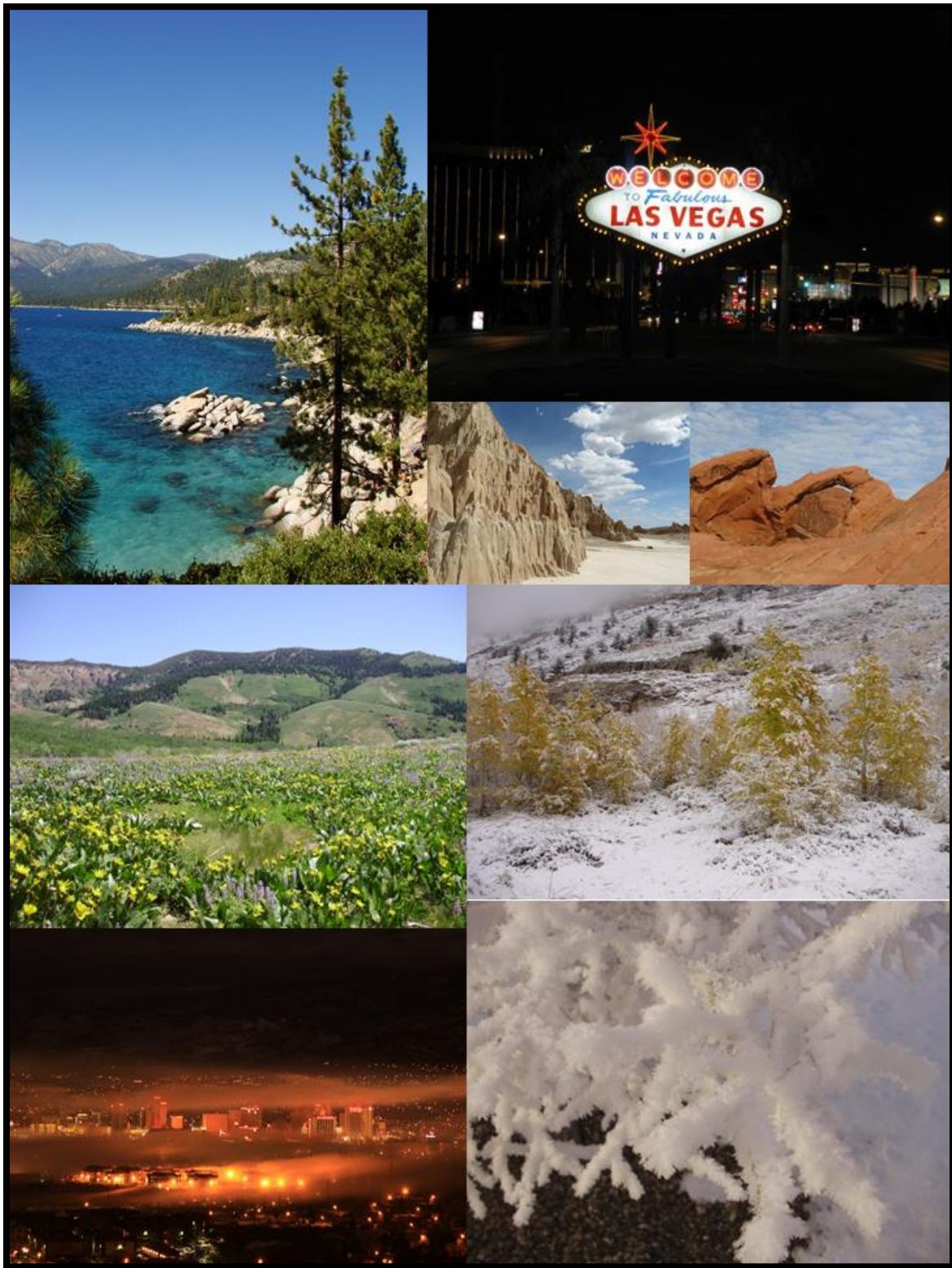


Nevada State Weather Records
